What could we do even better?

'Awareness of neuro diverse traits could be incorporated into training for all teaching staff and TAs.'

Whole school 'Making Sense of Autism' training was delivered as an INSET in February 2023. We deliver this on a 3-year cycle, and we have had very little staff turnover in this time. All teaching and support staff have also had training on ADHD awareness and practical strategies.

Our next step: To consider tier 2, 'Good Autism Practice', training for the whole school.

'Perhaps a bit of continuity with things like lunch time'

Lunchtimes are more difficult and there are children who find the dinner hall challenging. We could consider how to use spaces such as the top studio, but it is difficult to supervise and staff with an already stretched budget and no additional funding for this.

'Perhaps more regular updates on progress vs the plan/schedule'

'More communication regards progress.'

'We find the target sheet – reports and parents' evenings really helpful. It would be great to get a little more info on how our child does during his classes, if he is struggling and how we can help at home'.

Every teacher is a teacher of SEND and it is the teacher's job to communicate next steps in a child's learning. We plan on offering an additional parents' evening for our parents of children with SEND in the summer term to discuss targets, support in place and transition. Watch this space!

'When SENCo is not available, another appointed member of staff to speak with if needed on days the SENCo is not in school, especially for outside resources to contact to arrange meetings as sometimes there is a delay.'

Our SLT all work hard to support parents and have an open-door policy when our SENCo is not in school. The appointment of an Assistant SENCo to start in the Autumn term 2025, will help greatly with this and this is an area we had also identified.

'Being more pro-active to recognise changes/issues that will affect my child so that they can be talked through initially without me raising things'.

School staff will always try and talk through changes with pupils who need extra reassurance and provide time to do so. We encourage home/school communication so that concerns can be passed to school to work through.
